'Industrial Visit' to Yakult Danone Pvt. Ltd, Sonapat

Under the banner of Delhi Technical Campus, Greater Noida, School of Management (SOM) organized an Industrial visit to Yakult Danone Pvt. Ltd. on 5 September, 2017.

Students of MBA batch 2016-18 & 2017-19 were accompanied by two faculty members of SOM, Prof. JP Mahajan (HOD) & Prof. Ravi Kant Swami and two other faculty members, Ms Mansi & Ms Vhuyashi Das from the Departments of Computer Science and Applied Sciences respectively.

At the plant site, the staff explained the following details about the company:

- Yakult Danone India (P) Ltd is a 50:50 Joint Venture (JV) between Yakult Honsha, Japan and Groupe Danone of France, both of which are global probiotic leaders.
- The JV was formed in 2005 to manufacture and sell probiotic products in the Indian market. Yakult, a probiotic drink, was launched in India in 2007.
- Yakult is an ISO 9001:2008, HACCP and OHSAS 18001:2007 certified manufacturing firm in Sonapat. As a pioneer in probiotics, Yakult has

formidable research capabilities and product technologies in the field of probiotics.

- Yakult Central Institute for Microbiological Research has for years researched the use of intestinal bacteria as a factor in health maintenance, conducting a wide range of studies on the benefits of microorganisms in Japan.

Motivational Talk on:

'Expectations of the Corporate World from MBA Students' by Prof. Sanjiv Mittal, Dean USMS, GGSIPU

Under the aegis of Delhi Technical Campus, Greater Noida, the School of Management organised its first programme of the current academic session 2017-18 on a topical issue: 'Expectations of the Corporate World from MBA Students'. The most unique and noteworthy feature of the programme was its planning, organisation and execution by the self-motivated students of Management Discipline.

Prof. Mittal began his lecture by admiring the efforts of students in organising such a programme and based his prefatory remarks about the lecture theme by differentiating between Employability and Employment. With the help of numerous business examples, Prof. Mittal drove home the point that today's young professionals have to work hard to become employable by acquiring and developing a judicious mix of three key variables, namely, Knowledge, Skills and Attitude (KSA). He advised the students to limit the use of mobile phones and focus on reading good text and reference books in order to imbibe novel ideas and develop out-of-box thinking and logical reasoning. Prof. Mittal particularly emphasised the need for effective communication skills on the part of students so that they prove their worth in the present-day fiercely competitive

corporate world. While explaining the intricacies and nitty-gritties of complex corporate world, Prof. Mittal kept the audience in good humour by narrating interesting business stories and anecdotes and also sharing his rich experience as an academic.

Construction Site Visit to Ecotech

Staad Pro Software Training

The Department of Civil Engineering organized certified STAAD PRO Software Training Course for III year students from August 18, 2017 to September 30, 2017 (50 hrs course) under Mr. Amit Tiwari, Mr. Sandeep Pal and Mr. Vineesh Kumar of Lelogix Design Center under the supervision of faculty members i.e. Mr. Ankit Sahay and Mr. Sugandh Singh. Out of 62 students, 59 students enrolled for the course. This course includes the learning of not only all the commands but also updates made in the STAAD PRO software recently. This course will benefit the students in two ways.



Firstly, it will enhance the student's abilities to plan and make appropriate design of building and secondly, it will fulfill the need of the academic work. This course is entirely different from theoretical Structural Analysis.
